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# **Looking for** a real cutup? Yup, that's me

Chicago-based Jerry Soverinsky is riding coast-to-coast and documenting his trip weekly in the Herald.

Sit down for a drink with any cyclist (not too late, most are in bed by 9 p.m.), and you'll be bombarded with tales of harrowing on-the-road injuries: car doors that slam them into busy street traffic, resulting in a separated shoulder (been there, done that); mountain descents that turn frightful, as gravel patches send them tumbling end-over-end (been there, done that); or the all-too-common, low-flying bird mistakes bike helmet for giant bread crumb, causing rider to panic and wipe out, in the process knocking over a sidewalk produce stand (alas, been there, done that). But my injury earlier last week,

on the eastern border of Montana . well, this one is no Indiana

Iones tale.

My day had been nearly perfect. I awoke in my Montana motel, ex-cited to find the breakfast room featuring premium sugar cereals (no bran for me, Cap'n Crunch all the way!). And finally, tempera-tures had receded from the upper 90s, with overcast skies yielding a high of 72 degrees. Ideal for cycling.

I had virtual free reign of the state road, as traffic in remote eastern Montana was nearly nonexistent. This made the heavy tailwind all the more enjoyable, and I was cycling at a great pace. In fact, I decided to head for Williston, N.D., which would amount to roughly

100 miles for the day.

At the 70-mile mark, I stopped at a roadside diner for lunch. No.1 item on the menu: grilled cheese. Could the day get any better? After finishing my second sandwich, I decided that the day had to be captured, so I got out my digital camera and started framing the shot. I wanted to include the open prairie, diner, my bicycle and empty lunch plate in the picture, and was bouncing around excitedly for the proper

While backing up, I slammed my leg into a roadside planter — a halfbarrel rimmed with a rusted steel band - and immediately howled like a Montana coyote. The steel band had sliced open my leg, and there was a gash the size of an elephant's ear carved out of my flesh.

I bandaged my leg and cycled to Williston, 28 miles away, cursing myself en route. I parked my bike at the hospital and entered the ER, where a doctor proudly described my cut as "quite the flapper." Ten stitches and a tetanus shot later, I got back on my bike and headed for my motel, which I reached at the day's 102-mile mark.

Ten stitches. Tetanus shot. Great tailwind. All crucial elements in a cyclist's tale. But the roadside planter? Well, that's just between
