	 Be a role model for ethical behavior and invite them to share any issues or concerns they have. Help your people learn how to maintain the highest ethical standards by completing training and complying with our policies and practices. Understand what to do when an ethics-related issue is brought to your attention. Be knowledgeable and follow our non-retaliation policy. 			
Be a Role Model	 To become a successful role model, you should Review and apply the principles in our Code of Conduct, ensure you truly maintain an open door policy, be vocal about ethical behavior, continuously encourage your team to raise any issues or concerns that arise. and most importantly, demonstrate your support to those who do raise concerns. 			
Ethical Leadership Training O LEARN O ACT O SPEAK UP	Each year, you and your team members will complete the mandatory Ethical Leadership Training with three over-arching goals: LEARN what is required to maintain the highest ethical standards; ACT in accordance with the code of conduct; and SPEAK UP when concerns arise. Our Ethical Leadership Training programs detail our ethical standards and encourage your team members to act ethically and speak up when a doubt or concern arises. There are specific programs for salaried, clerical and plant employees each year.			

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	Maintaining the highest ethical standards is critical to the success of your team, and it's important that they complete all mandatory Ethical Leadership Training.
	To help reinforce our policies as well as clear up any ambiguities among team members, We'll look to you to gain a deep understanding of the relevant ethical policies and practices associated with your job, to properly advise your team when needed and foster an ethical culture. For instance, when working with external vendors, you must follow our anti-bribery, due diligence process. Our Global Business Practices guidelines, as well as our Compliance website and Colgate mobile app are instructive in this and other topics.
Non-retaliation policy	When a team member raises an ethical issue, listen first before responding and taking action, allowing them time to thoroughly explain their concerns.
